

## **ABSTRACT**

The title of this research is the influence of organizational behavior for the period 2018/2019 on student learning achievement in the pasundan university FKIP (survey of biology education study program student associations). The objectives of this study are (1) to know students as organizational behavior of student associations of biology education study programs. (2) to find out student achievement in the biology education study program association. (3) able to know organizational behavior towards student learning achievement. The approach used in this study is quantitative, with the survey method and data collection techniques used, in the form of a questionnaire for organizational behavior variables (variable X) and cumulative grade point index (GPA) for learning achievement variables (variable Y). And data processing techniques performed are validity test, reliability test, data normality test, simple linear regression analysis and coefficient of determination. This research hypothesis says "there is an influence of organizational behavior (x) on learning achievement (y)" students of the biology education study program association period 2018/2019. The results of this study there are enough influences between variables x and y variables which are equal to 0,003% or 0,03%. To find out the functional relationship between x variables and y variables, a simple linear regression analysis is used with the results of the calculation as follows:  $Y = 3,263 + (-0,002) X$  means that every organizational behavior (variable X) increases points will cause a tendency to increase learning achievement (variable Y) by -0,002. The conclusion of this research hypothesis is that it can be accepted because there is an influence between the variable X in the variable Y. As the end of this study the authors submit suggestions to all student associations of biology education study programs, so that students are able to prioritize their time to study. Good hours of study will affect the learning achievement that will be achieved.
