

**THE EFFECT OF EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES ON THE
ATTITUDE OF DISCIPLINE STUDENTS
(Survey Research in Class V of Primary Schools in Rancamanyar
Village, Baleendah District, Bandung Regency)**

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ABSTRACT

In accordance with the 2013 curriculum, Scouting extracurricular activities are compulsory activities held in schools in the hope of improving the discipline attitude of students in primary schools which are still considered to be lacking. This study aims to 1) find out the description of the scouting extracurricular activities 2) find out the influence of scouting extracurricular activities on students' disciplinary attitudes 3) find out how much is the relationship between scouting extracurricular activities on students' disciplinary attitudes 4) to find out how students' attitudes toward scouting extracurricular activities. This research was conducted in 5 public elementary schools in the Rancamanyar Village, Baleendah District. Data collection in this study used questionnaire instruments, observation sheets, interviews and documentation. The questionnaire instrument was developed using internal validity and external validity implemented at SDN Rancamanyar II. The questionnaire research instrument used 1 scouting questionnaire with 20 statements and 1 discipline attitude questionnaire with 22 statements. The results of the study were processed with descriptive statistical data analysis, prerequisite test analysis of normality test and linearity test with a significance value of $0.200 > 0.05$ which means the data is normally distributed and meets the normality test requirements. the coefficient values then carry out the hypothesis test using correlation analysis, simple regression, coefficient of determination and t test. Correlation test results of 0.701 which is a level of strong positive relationships, based on the results of simple regression analysis with a value of 27,185 and b value of 0.711, the coefficient of determination (R-Square) of 0.492 which illustrates that the disciplinary attitude of students is influenced by scouting extracurricular activities of 49.2% and 50.8% influenced by other factors not examined in this study, the results of the t test showed a significance value < 0.05 which means that there is an influence of scouting extracurricular activities on students' disciplinary attitudes.
