Capacity Enhancement of Women Entrepreneurs in Government Procurement System

Abstract-In the past decade, the Government of Indonesia has sought to improve efficiency, transparency and accountability, in the government procurement system. The establishment of the Government Goods / Service Procurement Policy Institution (LKPP) in 2007 has led to major changes to institutional and policy reforms as a government procurement system. The next step, the Government issued Presidential Decree No. 54 of 2010 which aims to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the use of public expenditure. Due to the increasing number of women workers and women entrepreneurs, the Government of Indonesia has sought to integrate gender aspects in the Modernization Project of Procurement of Goods and Services. This study aims to analyze the gender-based gap in government procurement systems. Qualitative studies are conducted to address gender issues in the procurement system, such as the opportunities, constraints, and challenges faced by women entrepreneurs when participating in the procurement process. The subjects of this study are women entrepreneurs who are members of the Indonesian Women Entrepreneurs Association (IWAPI) in several regions in Indonesia.

The results of this study recommend the importance of facilitation to achieve a better procurement system, as support for improving the capacity of women entrepreneurs in the government procurement system through two main areas: (1) Formalization of the definition of women-owned enterprises, which can be incorporated into LKPP data and monitoring systems so that women entrepreneurs can compete and gain an opportunity to win government contracts, (2) Improving the transparency of government procurement system with e-procurement system.
