

ABSTRACT

This thesis is about the relationship between street children perception about social services by adapting itself in the Rumah Mimpi of Bandung. The purpose of this insulation is to describe and analyze the perception of street children about social services in the Rumah Mimpi of Bandung, to describe and analyze the self-adjustment of street children in the Rumah Mimpi of Bandung, and to describe and analyze the relationship between street children's perception of social services with self-adjusting in the Rumah Mimpi of Bandung.

The Research method used in this research is a method of descriptive analysis, which is a method aimed at reviewing or describing the true condition at the time of research as a description of traits and relationships between the phenomena investigated. The data obtained first collected was then analyzed and interorganized to test the correctness of the hypothesis proposed. The data retrieval techniques conducted in this study are documentation studies, and field studies (non-participant observation, interviews, and poll).

The Sampling techniques used in this study were random sampling. The scale in this study uses a ordinal scale, for hypotheses testing used non-parametic statistic tests using Test Rank Spearman (RS). The population of this study is the children of the street in the Rumah Mimpi of Bandung, amounting to 48 people. Samples to be taken by 75% to 36 people.

Based on the results of this study show the relationship or correlation between the perception of street children about social services with the adjustment himself in the Rumah Mimpi the City of Bandung, so it can be said if the perception of street children, about social services is high then the adjustment himself in the Rumah Mimpi the City of Bandung will be good also. Overall, between the perceptions of street children about social services with the adjustment itself indicates the presence of correlation or a very strong relationship and direction.
