THE CONCEPT OF BULLYING VICTIMS WITH THE APPEARANCE OF

SOCIAL ROLES AT SMPN 9 SUMEDANG

**ABSTRACT** 

Bullying is an act committed by someone consciously or intentionally,

with the aim of hurting or terrorizing people who are considered weak by

themselves. This bullying action is often carried out by teenagers, especially

teenagers at SMPN 9 Sumedang, with the motive of revenge, terrorizing people

who are considered weak and there is no resistance, and venting the perpetrator's

frustration due to his parents. Based on the results of the study as many as 10% of

both perpetrators and victims who became bullying in the school. The concept of

bullying victims with the appearance of social roles at SMPN 9 Sumedang is very

significant, this is due to several factors that influence their social role, namely;

for victims of bullying; lack of strong policies that can protect victims, lack of

social support from any party. As for the perpetrators of bullying, they are

influenced by the media (such as often watching movies that contain elements of

bullying), environmental factors, lack of education from parents. The research

method used in this study uses qualitative research methods with the aim of

describing how The Concept of Bullying Victims with the appearance of social

roles at SMPN 9 Sumedang, using a case study approach. The informant selection

technique in this study used purposive sampling technique with 2 informants,

namely key informants; SMPN 9 Sumedang teenage students who were victims

of bullying, as well as additional informants; Student teachers and bk teachers.

Based on the results of the study, the data collection techniques used by

researchers are; interviews, observations, document studies.
