Abstract

The aim of this research is to identify the comparison between two novels by the same author, Ernest Hemingway, titled "The Old Man and The Sea" and "To Have and Have Not". This study investigates whether there are differences or similarities in how the author portrays the central characters in these two novels, which were published many years apart. The structuralism theory by Jauharoti is used to uncover the backgrounds of the central characters by first analyzing the intrinsic elements. After identifying these intrinsic elements, the similarities and differences is compared using comparative literature theory. The method used in this study is Descriptive Qualitative. The results show several similarities and differences between the two novels regarding both central character through plot and episodes, settings, and expressions and depictions. In conclusion, both novels have a similar plot flow from exposition to resolution. The settings provide a clear background for the central characters, explaining their story and motivations. Expressions and depictions clarify the characteristics, behavior, and physical conditions of the central characters.
